

GENERAL INFORMATION

Official Language

The official language of the Joint COST B27/SAN Training School: Neurofeedback and ADHD and International course and conference MIND AND BRAIN VI: Neuroplasticity of Brain and Behavior is English.

Certificate of Attendance, ECST and CME Credits

The participants will get the InterUniversity Centre Course and Conference certificates which may, depending on the policy of the study programs, be recognized as part of the curricula required for MSc or PhD degrees or bring CME credits.

For this international course and conference and training school we have requested CME credits from the Croatian Medical Chamber which sponsors continuing medical education for physicians.

Invitation Letter

Passport and Visa

A valid passport or some other identification document recognized by international agreement testifying the identity and citizenship of the bearer is required for entry into Croatia. Very few nationalities must have a visa. Personal Insurance

The COST B27/SAB and/or MIND AND BRAIN VI AND BRAIN V registration fees do not include insurance. Participants are responsible to arrange for appropriate insurance on their own. Health and accident insurance is recommended and has to be purchased in your country of origin.

Clothing

Currency and Exchange Facilities

Official currency of the Republic Croatia is the Croatian Kuna (HRK). Foreign currency may be exchanged at bank exchange counters and exchange offices, at post offices and travel agencies, hotels, and airports. All major credit cards are accepted in hotels, stores, and restaurants.
